

## Reading ideas for learning@home

It is important that the children read regularly even though they are not at school at the moment. As well as being an enjoyable activity to keep them busy, reading as much as possible will keep their skills sharp for when they come back to school. The children do not have their usual reading books from school at the moment. Here are some ideas about what they could read instead.

- Children in Years 1-6 will have their CGP books which are full of reading activities.
- Borrowbox is a great app which allows children to access thousands of books online (please see separate Borrowbox instructions sheet on the English page).
- If parents need ideas for which books their child could borrow from Borrowbox (or buy online), there will be a 'Recommended reads' sheet put on each class page this week.
- Children can read whole books for free at <https://home.oxfordowl.co.uk/books/free-ebooks/>. Parents will need to register but there is no cost. The books are organised by age.
- <https://www.lovereadings4kids.co.uk/> is another great website. It is free for children to join. Although they will not be able to download whole books on it, there are extracts from hundreds of good books. They can choose book extracts for their age so you know they will be appropriate.
